Tax Scams

Got a call or email from the CRA? Make sure it's real!

You get a text message or an email from the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) claiming you're entitled to an extra refund and all you need to do is provide your banking details. Watch out this wonderful if true situation is exactly what a tax scam looks like. Another variation is that they call you to say that you owe the CRA money and that you need to pay right away, or else they will report you to the police. In any case, if you do receive a call, letter, email, or text saying you owe money to the CRA, you can double check online via "My Account" or call 1-800-959-8281.

Tips to protect yourself:

The CRA will never:

- · use aggressive or threatening language.
- threaten you with arrest or send police.
- ask for payments via prepaid credit card, or gift cards, such as iTunes, Home Depot, etc.
- use text messages to communicate under any circumstances.
 Emails from the CRA:
- never ask for financial information.
- never provide financial information

The CRA's accepted payment methods are:

- online banking.
- debit card.
- pre-authorized debit.

If you suspect a scam, always report it.
