Blue: Impossible, Unattainable

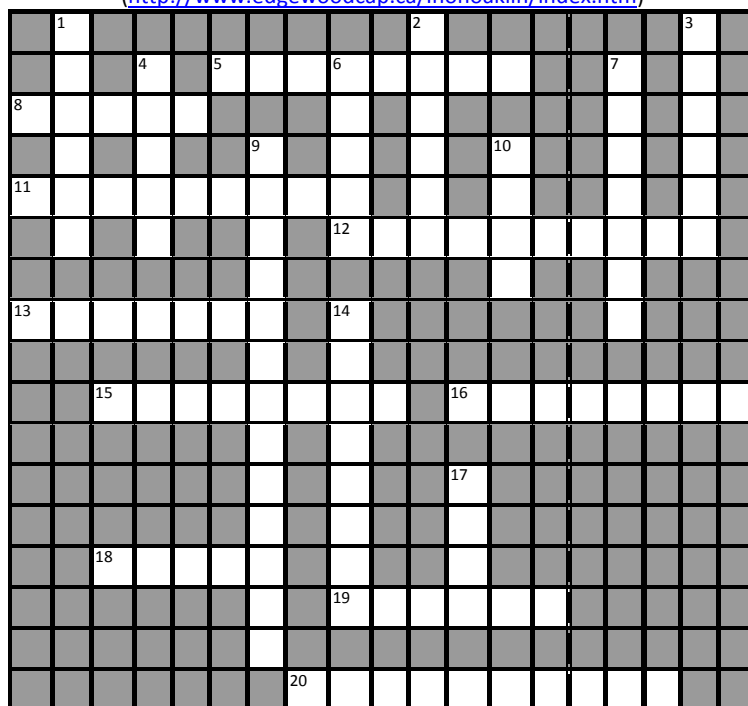
Black: New Beginnings, Rebirth
