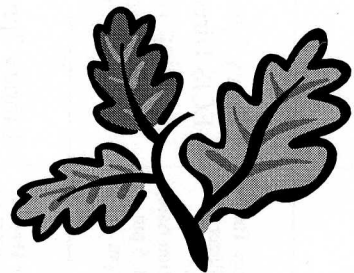
Tim Totten Wears a New CAP
