Internment Camps

On August 9th, 1915, an internment camp was opened near Edgewood to house Germans during "the" war. About fifty men, many of them miners from the Crowsnest pass area, were housed in tarp roofed forestry style bunkhouses for more than two years. The camps were surrounded by chicken wire fences and guarded by armed soldiers. The prisoners were required to work at building a road to the Okanagan with hand tools through uncleared land, across Fire Valley, and onto the Monashee.
