Inonoaklin Edgewood Broadband meets with BC Hydro

On Tuesday September 18th a team from BC Hydro came to visit the Edgewood Community Internet Society at The Edge to follow-up on long term discussions which began in May at the British Columbia Broadband Association Conference in Vancouver. Topics for discussion were tower locations and wireless Inonoaklin Edgewood Broadband network technology.

On Thursday September 20th they returned for a tour of the access points from Goat Mountain. They also viewed how client radios were frequently situated in close proximity to hydro meters.

The BC Hydro team learned of the diversity of our landscape. From Goat Mountain it was clear the challenges faced by IEB staff to put a broadband canopy in the air over the valley. The BC Hydro team left to go back to the drawing board with continued dialog open.
